## **International Corner**

From the Desk of Dan Halstrom, USMEF President and CEO

U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF), a contractor to the Beef Checkoff gathers global staff and representatives early each year for week-long meetings to discuss global supply and demand forecasts and USMEF marketing plans for the coming 18 months. This meeting, held earlier this month, is a cross-fertilization of marketing ideas and innovations in preparation for the industry's FY2024 Unified Export Strategy for USDA.

Major points of discussion during the USMEF meetings included the continuing rebound in Asia's foodservice sector, the expected surge in consumer spending as China recovers from COVID, and USMEF's global initiatives to broaden and expand demand for underutilized U.S. beef cuts and variety meat items.

- Outback Steakhouse Switches to U.S. Beef in Korea: With 84 restaurants and 51 delivery stores, Outback Steakhouse has developed a major footprint in the lucrative Korean market. USMEF has promoted U.S. beef with Outback for many years and is pleased to report that the chain decided late last year to completely switch to U.S. beef on all of its steak menus. To co-brand Outback's commitment to U.S. beef, USMEF supported the development of high-quality delivery and take-out steak boxes for Outback customers.
- Strong Turnout for Red Meat Industry at Major Food Show in Vietnam: Following a two-year absence, more than 300 exhibitors from 28 countries recently welcomed 16,000 visitors at the three-day Food and Hotel Vietnam show in Ho Chi Minh City. The U.S. red meat industry was well represented as seven U.S. suppliers participated at the USMEF booth. USMEF sponsored and supplied beef striploin and brisket bones for two cooking sessions of the show's Vietnam Culinary Challenge.
